

Regular D&T monitoring is carried out by the subject leader with feedback given to staff.

In our Mix-Up afternoons children from EYFS to Y6 work together on themed activities involving D&T.

Each year we have fun taking part in Den Day organised by Save the Children. Our pupils learn about building shelters and the importance of shelters across the world whilst raising money.

The subject leader meets with D&T co-ordinators from other 2 schools termly as part of our triad monitoring process and to share good practice.

Skills ladders are in place for all year groups with links made to previous learning.

## What does it look like?

Termly Inspire workshops give children the opportunity to work collaboratively with family members on designing and making activities linked to the year group's current Discovery Quest topic.

A subject leader report is sent to our governors at the end of each school year.

D&T vocabulary is taught where relevant within a Discovery Quest unit. Vocabulary is linked to materials, tools, components, equipment and processes.

Every year in December each class is given a budget to design and make items to be sold at a class stall to raise money for the PTFA.

Design and Technology is taught through our Discovery Quest topics in all year groups.
