

# Year 6 Writing Project

6th -10<sup>th</sup> April

This week, I would like you to access the Oxford Owl Ebooks and read to Chapter 2 of 'Air Raid'. You can find instructions on how to access the Ebooks under Year 6, Week 3 on the Home Learning Page.

Task 1: (Monday) To retrieve information and make inferences about a text.

Read 'Air Raid' up to page 25 (Chapter 2) and discuss the text with a family member.

- Tell them about what you have read and what you know about the characters.
- When is the book set?
- Is there another book that this one is similar to that you have previously read? What are these similarities?
- What do you think will happen next? What makes you think that?
- What is the RAF and why is the dog named this?

Task 2: (Tuesday) To identify the features of a description.

Read the 'Setting Description' on the home learning page and identify the features.

- How is the writing organised?
- How is a description different to a story (narrative)?
- What is described in the text?
- Pick out some good adjectives.
- What grammatical features have been used? E.g. relative clause, (fronted) adverbials, adjectives, figurative language (metaphor, simile, personification), expanded noun phrases.



Task 4: (Thursday) To write descriptions of what you can hear, see and smell.

From the perspective of Jack or Harry, what can they see, hear and smell at the beginning of the book when they see the bomb?

<b>See</b>	<b>Hear</b>	<b>Smell</b>

Task 5: (Friday) To write a description of what Jack and Harry see at the beginning of the book.

Use the work you have done so far and include some of your expanded noun phrases. Your description should be first person, writing from either the perspective of Jack or Harry.
